She also progressed and arranged two 40 feet containers of donated hospital equipment for the Sierra Leone Police Hospital, along with donated uniforms for the National Fire Force in Sierra Leone. The Fire Chief there refers to her as the 'Iron Lady'. Also included in this container was donated football strips from Ross County Football Club, in Scotland, UK for a local football club in Sierra Leone (2021). In 2023 she prepared arrangements for a container of donated equipment from the International Fire and Rescue Association (IFRA), Scotland, UK for the National Fire Force in Sierra Leone, to increase their capability for fire and flood response and travelled as the volunteer coordinator for training of the Sierra Leone National Fire Force with the IFRA (2023).

During her travels in Africa, Elizabeth has seen the passion and commitment in communities in coming together to play / watch football and got involved herself in Maiduguri, Borno. In 2025 she was awarded a merit award in recognition for dedication, services and support towards sports development in Borno State, Nigeria.
